







Guide to collecting samples of mould / fungi

- by destructive sampling or using adhesive tape lifts

- If there are fears of breathing in spores or toxins from the mouldy area, wear a mask and even goggles
- If destructively sampling, saw or cut as much as possible into the substrate supporting the mould growth (wood / Gib board / paper / fibre-board) before removal. Try not to rip or tear away the sample. This minimises the disruption of the fungus and attached spores.
- Place samples into labelled press or zip-lock plastic bags
- If taking adhesive tape lift from the substrate, use either normal clear adhesive tape (i.e. Diamond Sellotape®) or Raeco 24 or 36mm wide backed book tape. If using non-backed adhesive tape, DO NOT fold on itself but stick down lightly onto grease-proof paper or equivalent.
- Label the backing paper (or place into a labelled envelope).
- Press the tape FIRMLY onto the surface that is being sampled.
- Fill out details below and courier or post to the laboratory
